117th IATP Conference in Riga, Latvia on March 10 – 14, 2018: Highlights

The 117th IATP Conference, supported by Storm Aviation – Diamond Sponsor – and by Thales, GECAS and FEAM – Silver Sponsors, was held at Radisson Blu Latvija Conference & Spa Hotel, from March 10th to 14th, 2018.

During the conference, more than 1,200 meetings were scheduled among the 400 representatives from 108 Airline Members, 35 Associate Members, and several authorized suppliers. The goal was to identify new pooling opportunities and/or negotiate terms and conditions of pooling contracts for the forthcoming season. The participants also had the opportunity to attend sessions aimed at providing updates about IATP pooling activities and the aviation industry in general.

Conference highlights:

- IATA Head of Ground Operations, Airport, Passenger, Cargo and Security, Mr. Joseph Suidan, and Aviation Ground Services Agreements (AGSA) Technical Group Chairperson, Mr. Christian Bergfelder, attended the conference. - The dedicated parts pools meetings facilitated the communication of latest updates between same fleet type operators.
