The 132nd IATP Conference Successfully Concludes in Bali, Indonesia

Bali, Indonesia — The 132nd International Airlines Technical Pool (IATP) Conference was successfully held from **27 September to 1 October 2025** at the **Grand Hyatt Bali Resort**, bringing together more than **600 representatives** from Airlines, Associate Members, and Authorized Guest Vendors from around the world.

Conference Highlights

- Membership Growth: Six new airlines Copa (CM), Iberojet (E9), Eurowings (EW), Air Arabia (G9), Omni Air (OY), and VietJet (VJ) along with one new Associate Member, Hangar 901, joined IATP. This growth brings the organization to a record 143 Member Airlines and 45 Associate Members, effective November 01st, 2025.
 In total, the 132nd IATP Conference hosted representatives from over 200 air transport industry companies.
- **Observer Participation:** Five airlines interested in future IATP membership attended the conference as **Observers**.

Participants also enjoyed **hospitality events** at the end of each business day. On Sunday, they participated in a cultural tour, which included a visit to Taman Ayun, featuring an exclusive Barong Dance performance, followed by a trip to the iconic Tanah Lot Temple and its scenic coastal surroundings.
